We are told to give thanks to God, and ther	we are given some reasons for giving thanks.
Notice that we are told to give thanks	, before all of the reasons are given. We
first give thanks to God because He is Good	—because of who He is—apart from anything that
He does for us. It's because we know that I	le is Good, and that we delight to get to know God

Between verses 8-12, there are 10 exhortat	ions—imperative verbs that tell us to do something:

- 1. Oh, give thanks to the Lord
- 2. Call upon His Name
- 3. Make known His deeds among the peoples
- 4. Sing Praises to Him
- 5. Speak of All His Wonders
- 6. **Boast in His Holy Name**
- 7. Let the heart of those who seek the Lord be glad.
- 8. Seek the Lord and His Strength.
- 9. Seek His face continually
- 10. Remember His wonderful Deeds which He has done

It's as if David, the Psalmist of Israel i	s giving the whole nation of Israel a	on how
to worship and praise God. And this	is how we should give	to God and praise
Him, since this is how He wants to be	praised and thanked.	
And then we're given the	why we should be thanking Hi	m and praising Him.
He reminds them of who they are: "r	emember that you were chosen by	God". And we must
remember that we were	by God. We see God, over and	over again
and	for those who are His—and	He will do the same for
us.		
We're called to sing and proclaim that	t God has made a way to be saved-	-
through belief in Jesus Christ, His Son	, whom He has provided as the pay	ment for sin. And
we're to announce this Salvation	day. We're to announ	ce it to whomever the
Holy Spirit directs us to—sharing the	Good News. And notice that it's no	t just the pastors who
are supposed to do this—it's everyor	ie. So when is the last time that you	ı proclaimed or
announced the Lord's Salvation—whe	en's the last time you told someone	about your
Jesus?		
So we are encouraged to bestow upo	n God, or ascribe to Him, or acknow	vledge that He has
Glory and Strength.		
So, we read, that the people followed	d David's instructions, his pattern fo	r praising and giving
thanks to God. The time of	after the destruction b	by the Babylonians was
one of the lowest in the history of Isr	ael. They were rebuilding a destroy	ed land. But God was
still on His throne, and whether it wa	s during the highlight of Israel's hist	ory while David was
with all of his might	t before the Ark of the Lord, or whe	ther it was during the
dark days of rebuilding, this praising	of God and thanking Him for His Go	odness and
Lovingkindness was the	thing to do. Whether in go	od times, or in bad
times, we and praise th	ne Lord.
